Appointment of Acting Commissioner for Mine Safety and Health

Recommendation

 Approve the appointment of Paul Kevin Harrison as Acting Commissioner for Mine Safety and Health until such time as the Governor-in-Council appoints a person to that office.

Sign the attached instrument of appointment (Attachment 1).

Timing

 Urgent. Appointment is necessary for the performance of certain Commissioner duties including the initiation of prosecutions under four separate Acts. Stewart Bell ceases to fill the position of Commissioner on Friday 25 January 2013.

Background

- 4. The statutory position of Commissioner for Mine Safety and Health was authorised by the Mines and Energy Legislation Amendment Act 2009, which was assented to on 12 June 2009.
- 5. Despite the Rublic Service Act 2008, section 8, the Commissioner is a public service officer employed under the Public Service Act 2008, and not under mining safety and health legislation.
- 6. A person may hold the office of Commissioner as well as another position under the Public Service Act 2008. To be appointed as Commissioner, a person must have a science or engineering qualification relevant to the mining industry and professional experience in mine safety and health.
- 7. The functions of the Commissioner are:
 - to advise the Minister on mine health and safety matters generally.
 - to fulfil the roles of chairperson of both mining safety and health advisory councils.
 - to monitor and report to the Minister and to Parliament on the administration of provisions about safety and health under mining safety and health legislation.
 - to perform the functions given to the Commissioner under the provisions of mining safety and health legislation.

- 8. In addition to these duties the Commissioner is authorised to initiate prosecutions under the following Acts:
 - Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999
 - Explosives Act 1999
 - Mining and Quarrying Safety and Health Act 1999
 - Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004.
- 9. There is provision under Section 73BA of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999 (Attachment 2) for the chief executive to appoint an Acting Commissioner. It is proposed that Paul Harrison be appointed as Acting Commissioner pending the appointment of a Commissioner for Mine Safety and Health by Governor-In-Council. Paul Harrison meets the qualification requirements of the Section 73B of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999 in that he has a science qualification relevant to the mining industry and has professional experience in mine safety.

73BA Acting commissioner

- (1) The chief executive may appoint a person who is eligible for appointment as commissioner to act in the office of commissioner during any period or all periods when—
- (a) the office is vacant; or
- (b) the person holding the office is absent from duty or is, for another reason, unable to perform the functions of the office.
- (2) The appointment is for the term, and on the conditions, decided by the chief executive.
- (3) The chief executive's power to appoint a person to act in the office of the commissioner does not limit the Governor in

Council's powers under the Acts Interpretation Act 1954, section 25(1)(b)(ii), (iv) or (v).

Mr Harrison holds a Bachelor of Applied Science (Chemistry) and has 25 years' experience and expertise in various aspects of mine safety and health in the private and public sectors. This has included mine safety work in USA, China and India, particularly in the area of improving mine gas monitoring practices and risk management. He has performed his current role for the past seven years. In this role, Mr Harrison is responsible for the management and strategic direction of Simtars, one of the world's premier mine safety research and technical services organisations.

Mr Harrison has nearly 20 years' experience in the control of coal mine fires and explosions. He has been involved in the ongoing development and support of the mine gas monitoring technology to prevent mine fires and explosions. He was involved in the emergency response to the Moura No 2 and Pike River mine disasters as well as a number of mine fires. He was the project manager for a major Australian Coal Association Research Program funded project to prove modified jet engines as inert gas generators for coal mine fire control. The Queensland Government subsequently equipped the Queensland Mines Rescue Service with this capability which has been used at Blair Athol and Southland mines in Australia, Loveridge Mine in the United States and Pike River Mine in New Zealand.
